Summary of Topics

This revision of ANSI/UL 1989 dated November 9, 2018 includes the following changes in requirements:

Revision of 1.1 to clarify what types of batteries are covered the standard.

Revision of 1.3 to clarify that lithium batteries are excluded.

Revision of terminology used in 4.2 and 4.3 to clarify that the standard covers lead acid and similar batteries.

Revision of flame arrestor tests in 7.3.2, 7.5.2, and 7.6.1.

The new and revised requirements are substantially in accordance with Proposal(s) on this subject dated July 27, 2018 and September 21, 2018.
